Welcome back to the summer term. The class have come back very settled. I am very much looking forward to the Year 6 auditions for the KS2 performance. The summer term for Liberty consists of many exciting activities and the practising for the performance. For Year 6 their SATS week begins on Monday 11th May. Below is the information to provide key information about our learning this summer term. Please remember that if you have any questions or concerns, do not hesitate to come and see us. The best time to catch us is after school once all children have been picked up.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	To begin the spring term we are going to start with 'Holes.' Our focus with this text is persuasion. We will be writing persuasive brochures and a persuasive speech. Following this, we are going to base our writing based a video clip called Ruins. In readiness for SATS, we will spend time revisiting key grammar terminology.
Mathematics	To begin the summer term Year 6 will start with the algebra unit and Year 5 will focus on negative numbers. Before SATS, time will be spent revisiting prior learning in maths and focus on problem solving. As well, we will spend time exploring ratio and reading and interpreting timetables. After half term, we will complete investigations and address gaps.
Science	Our topics in science this term are: animals including humans and living things and their habitat'. In animals, including humans we will be describing the changes as humans develop to old age. After half term, for living things in their habitats describe the life process of reproduction in some animals and plants.
Computing	For the first part of the summer term we will be learning about 3D modelling. They will initially familiarise themselves with working in a 3D space, moving, resizing, and duplicating objects. In the sensing movement unit after half term we will use micro bits. It is important that we are teaching children how to be safe online. For each half term there will be an explicit online safety lesson.
PE	Liberty will have two PE sessions each week. For the first part of the summer term our PE units are dodgeball and athletics and after half term the focus will be rounders and tennis. PE days will continue to be Monday and Tuesday.
Geography	In the first part of the spring term, we will be answering our enquiry question 'How and why do coastlines change?' This topic focuses on coasts. We will begin with locating coasts by using goggle maps. Then explore how coastlines have changed by erosion, weathering and the impact of sea levels. At the end of the unit we will answer our enquiry question.
History	Children will learn how Benin grew into a successful and wealthy kingdom through its skilled craftspeople, organised guilds and trade with Europe. They will also explore the challenges Benin faced and the reasons for its eventual decline
RE	This term, pupils will be exploring how religion and worldviews have changed across Somerset over the past 10–20 years. Using real census data, they will learn how to read, interpret and analyse information to understand patterns and trends in our local area. Through this, children will consider questions such as: How has the number of people identifying with different religions changed? and What might these changes tell us about our community?
Music	In music Liberty will be learning the songs ready for the KS2 performance.
PSHE	Our first topic in PSHE is 'Being my Best.' We will explore how to keep ourselves safe and how we can contribute to a healthy lifestyle. After half term the topic is focusing on 'Growing and Changing.' More information will follow in a letter later this half term.
D & T & ART	We will begin the spring term with DT. In DT we will be making fish cakes. In preparation to designing their fishcake they will learn about seasonality. The skills we are focusing on for DT this term are boiling and frying which will be developed as they make their fishcakes. After half term we will focus on art. This will link to our History topic on Benin and their sculptures. We will use frameworks to provide stability and form.

MATHEMATICS

Children will be set maths homework from their CGP book on a Friday. This needs to be handed in on the following Thursday.

GRAMMAR AND SPELLING

Children will take home 10 spellings to learn each week. These spellings will be linked to a spelling rule.

Spellings will be given on a Friday and children will be tested on these spellings the following Friday.

Children will be set grammar homework from their CGP book on a Friday. This needs to be handed in on the following Thursday.



READING

Children will take home books to read at home. They will be expected to read 4 times a week. Reading at home is to be recorded in their reading record books by parents/ carers.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- ◆ Please ensure your child brings in their reading book and reading record every day.
- ◆ Homework is set on a **Friday**. Please help your child to complete their homework and return it to school the following **Thursday**.
- ◆ Please sign your child's reading record each time you hear them read.
- ◆ Our PE day is a **Monday and Tuesday**. Please can children come to school in their PE kit on these days.
- ◆ We ask that your child does not bring in any toys or pencil cases from home. The reason for this is that items usually become the source of conflict and/or upset because they get damaged, lost or "borrowed" by others.
- ◆ We encourage children to drink water regularly during the day and water bottles can be brought in daily and stored in our tray.
- ◆ Please ensure your child brings a coat to school everyday so they can have access to outside play during break and lunchtime.
